



## Manor Infant School and Nursery Governing Board.

The following are short introductions to the members of your school's governing board.

**Christine Elmer: Local Authority Governor and Chair of Governors**

I have been a governor at Manor Infant School since September 2013; initially as vice-chair of the Interim Executive Board and, since October 2014, as Chair of Governors.

My reasons for taking on the roles were twofold. Firstly, I hoped that my wide-ranging experience in the field of education would prove useful. I've been a teacher (initially in a number of Portsmouth schools), headteacher, teacher trainer and leadership advisor, both in the UK and abroad. I am now semi-retired but still work with the National College for Teaching and Leadership carrying out assessments of aspiring headteachers as well as middle and senior school leaders. Secondly, I have enjoyed working with the school staff at all levels and seeing the cultural changes that have been made. Manor Infants has now been graded by Ofsted as a Good school in all areas. This is a clear testament to the hard work and dedication of the staff and to their shared understanding of the needs of young children when enabling them to fulfil their potential and develop a love of learning.

School governors have an important part to play in setting the strategic direction of the school, as well as acting as critical friends, and I am enjoying the part I am playing in this journey.

**Daphne Gale: Co-Opted Governor.**

I spent most of my teaching career in Portsmouth and strongly believe that Portsmouth children can and should achieve at the highest levels. I joined the governing board of Manor Infants when it was in Special Measures and have been part of the school's journey to its present position of Good. It has been an incredible journey working with such a passionate Head Teacher and Staff who are absolutely determined to do their best for every single child.

Three of my grandchildren have grown up in the area and attended local schools. One has just left university, one has just started at Portsmouth University, and a third is at college. I have a fourth grandchild with severe special needs. I volunteer with support 4SEND which supports parents of special needs children in Hampshire and as a result, visit many different schools in the county. I am

the SEN Governor at Manor Infants and regularly witness the high quality practises that take place in this school.

### Shereen Robinson: Co-Opted Governor.
