


# **Nursery Newsletter Winter 2018**

What are the children learning?

At the nursery, we plan a variety of exciting activities for the children which are carried out in our daily small group time. Each group meets with their Keyperson and takes part in an activity based on the children's needs and interests. Some examples of these are, Playdough, ice play, cars, dinosaurs. We have even turned the home corner into a supermarket based on their interests. As well as this, we also bring them new experiences through our overarching topic.
